Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill requires the application form for a motor vehicle registration to include language allowing an applicant to voluntarily indicate that he has been diagnosed with, or is the parent or legal guardian of a child or ward who has been diagnosed with, certain disabilities or disorders. If the applicant indicates one of the specified diagnoses on the application, the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) must include the designation "SAFE," which is the abbreviation for "Safeguarding American Families Everywhere," in the motor vehicle record but may not include personal identifying information or any diagnosis. DMV is required to allow an owner or co-owner to update a motor vehicle registration to include or remove the "SAFE" designation at any time.

The bill charges DMV with additional responsibilities that the agency can accomplish with existing appropriations. Therefore, there is no expenditure impact to DMV. However, DMV indicates that the complex coding changes to its IT system will require at least twelve months to implement and test.
