Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill requires the Department of Public Health (DPH) to create informational pamphlets or posters for state governmental entities on rendering seizure first aid to an individual who has suffered a seizure in the workplace. Additionally, this bill requires the chief executive officer of every state governmental entity to post the informational pamphlet or poster on rendering seizure first aid in a conspicuous location frequented by employees.

This bill will have no fiscal impact on DPH. The agency anticipates being able to handle the responsibilities of this bill within existing staff and appropriations.

The Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office (RFA) anticipates that all state agencies and local governments will comply with the provisions of the bill. Therefore, the bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on state agencies or local governments.
